### HOW TO FIND IT

### OPENING HOURS

From Monday to Saturday from 8 am to 12 noon  
(except on holidays)

### WHAT YOU CAN TAKE THERE

In addition to the waste collected during door-to-door collection: electrical and electronic appliances (WEEE), grass clippings and branches, wood, bulky items, batteries and expired medication, printer toners and consumables, ferrous and non-ferrous metals, paints, solvents and detergents, used vegetable oils.

### WHAT YOU CAN'T TAKE THERE

Asbestos (contact specialised disposal firms), car lead-based batteries, used mineral oils.



## Home collection

For large pieces of furniture and household appliances, grass clippings and branches, you can request the **free home collection service by calling the freephone number (Italy only) 800.212.488** from Monday to Saturday between 9 am and 12 noon.

Paper, cardboard and Tetra Pak packs

In paper bags or cardboard boxes

Home collection  
**ON FRIDAY**

#### WHAT CAN GO IN:

drinks cartons (such as Tetra Pak), newspapers, magazines, cardboard, pizza boxes (not the dirty parts), hand-written pages, flattened boxes.

**WHAT CAN'T:** oily or dirty paper, nylon, cellophane, plastic-coated paper.

**WARNING** pizza boxes, when clean, should be disposed of with paper and cardboard



Organic Waste

In biodegradable or paper bags, inside the brown bin

Home collection  
**ON MONDAYS AND FRIDAYS**

#### WHAT CAN GO IN:

fruit and vegetable scraps, dry bread, rotten food, coffee grounds and tea bags, kitchen roll, tissues, paper napkins, dirty paper, pizza boxes (the dirty parts), dried ashes, flower clippings and small plants, small bones and dry fruit shells and eggshells.

**WHAT CAN'T:** anything that is not naturally degradable, such as: plastic bags, nappies, sanitary towels, rags, cigarette butts.

**ADVICE** if you have an outdoor area, dispose of your organic waste yourself by composting it



Plastic packaging and tins

Packaging that has been emptied thoroughly and flattened, in semi-transparent bags

Home collection  
**ON TUESDAYS AND SATURDAYS**

#### WHAT CAN GO IN:

plastic bottles and phials, plastic plates and cups without any food residue, carrier bags, yoghurt pots, plastic food packets and packaging, polystyrene blisters, aluminium tins, metal bottle caps, food boxes, tin foil.

**WHAT CAN'T:** plastic and rubber items that are not used for packaging (with the exception of plastic plates and cups), toys, basins.

**NEW** we confirm the extension of the differentiated waste disposal to disposable plastic plates and cups



Glass

Loose inside the green bin

Home collection  
**ON TUESDAYS**

#### WHAT CAN GO IN:

bottles, cups, phials, broken items only made of glass.

#### WHAT CAN'T:

ceramic, mirrors, light bulbs, neon bulbs, demijohns.



Dry non-recyclable waste

In the grey bin, in semi-transparent bags

Home collection  
**ON MONDAYS**

#### WHAT CAN GO IN:

all non-recyclable materials, rubber, nappies and sanitary towels, cosmetics, light bulbs.

**WHAT CAN'T:** anything that is recyclable

**WARNING** the dry waste and plastic collection bags must be semi-transparent. This way, the disposal operator can check the contents.
